Whether Nedlands' is successful or not in winning the category, as a club we are certainly reaping the benefits of our focus on introducing juniors and adults alike to the sport of sailing with new members and a pool of new crew members that allows more boats to get out on the water.

On the budget front it appears that we may end the year with a slight surplus which is fantastic considering this year we have again continually improved our facilities and sustainability with new ramp, new support boat and a new 15kw Solar system to be installed in the next couple of weeks. The club has also invested in improving our policies and procedures with the engagement of HR and Employment specialists which will put us in good stead going forward.

On a sad and sobering note, the sailing community lost two of our own recently with the passing of Rob Thomas and Paul Owen during the Bunbury and Return Ocean Race. The Nedlands Yacht Club extends its heartfelt condolences to the families and friends of Rob and Paul, and our thoughts are with the members of Fremantle and Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Clubs. The recent unfortunate events remind us all that even though Nedlands Yacht Club sails within safer waters of the Swan River there are always inherent risks in the sport of sailing and we must always be vigilant in mitigating risks by sailing to the weather conditions, sailing to our skill levels and maintaining our boats in seaworthy condition.

On the water our sailors continue to excel in the various fleets and I congratulate our Hobie 16 and National 125 sailors that won and placed at their recent State Championships. I also congratulate all Nedlands sailors

for your continued support of such events and also supporting other clubs, in particular regional based clubs, either on the water as a competitor or as a volunteer organising the events. Nedlands sailors and volunteers have a great tradition and reputation for supporting sailing events held across the state.

#### **REGATTA REPORT**

Since we came back from the break it's been quite busy. We had the short course regatta and HMAS Perth memorial regatta in quick succession. Both of which went very well attracting good if not spectacular numbers. Both regattas were in the safe hands of John McKechnie as race officer and went off very smoothly, he has obviously come to some sort of arrangement with Huey as the weather played the game for both. Thanks to all the volunteers that make these events possible not only on water but in the club house. Thanks to all the ladies behind the scenes at HMAS Perth and those members who brought cakes in for the event. The Skates had a little reunion at the club and all got to have a marvel at the new Skate being sailed down there on the day. A much more high tech vessel than the originals made of wood.

Our training and junior fleets are both gathering momentum. The training under Graham Pennifold has grown with many more courses being run this year than last. This influx of keen potential crews and skippers is spreading around the fleets. With cruisers, 125, F11 and Hobies all picking up new members of their classes. This is the main strategy to grow member numbers and it's starting to show results.

One thing to remember is that those that do a start sailing course have membership for that season, so picking up these people as crew means they don't have pay again that season! So, don't be reluctant to pick up the keen start sailing people.

The juniors are doing well, the number have fluctuated a bit this season but seem to have come back strongly with an influx of small people into the Optimists and F11. The club will also use the training Hobie 16's with juniors at some point, we have procured 3 old main sails and will cut them down so the Juniors can get into having a go at a Hobie. We have also kicked off our second Hobie 16 sailing course which is great.

Members duties and volunteering. Remember we need to help each other run the club on Sunday and during the rest of the year. Members are asked to do at least two duties a year. We have this season skated very close to the edge of not running Sunday sailing on several occasions. Next season when you renew your membership you will be required to submit duties you are prepared to undertake and the dates. At Busy Bee's there will also be a sheet with all the potential dates out for you to nominate duties. This will form the basis of the yellow book and Dutyman for the coming season. With Dutyman because of its flexibility we have not relied on just selecting a date and duty and naming someone, we have largely let them pick their own duties and dates. This has resulted in 80 odd people doing duties often multiple times and 214 that haven't done any. If you're not in the 80 please log on and help. <a href="Dutyman Link">Dutyman Link</a>. The Traveller email has carried tips and tricks for Dutyman and a link so there has been plenty of information put out there. At the club we have at least one sometimes two laptops that can logon to Dutyman please ask the Management Rep if you want to logon and have a look.




#### FINANCIAL MATTERS

In going back through the past Annual Reports from 2008 to 2017 a number of financial facts emerged. Although audit reporting has changed and made some comparisons difficult the following makes for interesting comparisons.

The annual revenue over this period has increased from \$292,914 in 2007/2008 to \$834,997 in 2016/2017 with increases every year apart from a dips in revenue in 2013/2014 and 2015/2016.

#### Revenue and Profit 2007/2008 to 2016/2017



**Note:** Years shown in the graph refer to end date of our financial years which run from May to April.

The impact of trading profit on overall revenue is obvious. The dip in 2013 and 2014 reflects costs associated with events, particularly purchasing costs. This was turned around by engaging more diligently with product providers in 2015 resulting in improved profitability.

The 3 deficit years resulted from different causes. In 2011 it was due to a major expenditure on sewerage half which was supported by a levy that had run up to the end of the 2009 financial year. The other half coming out of the overall revenue for 2010/2011. This was a budgeted deficit. The deficit in 2013/2014 was a clear reflection on a trading downturn.

The deficit last financial year coming largely from a wages claim from employment of a bosun needing to meet the strict employment rules now in place. Previously we had paid a stipend and provided accommodation. This is something we will not be able to do into the future. We now employ 2 full time permanent staff members and number of casuals including a bosun and training coordinator. Our wages bill is now \$290,000 per year with all of the add ons and management requirements including increasing industrial relations requirements, insurance etc.

The above demonstrates how important our trading profit is to the financial viability of the club. The two major sources of revenue are now clearly trading profit, membership and storage. The importance of events is central to our financial future. It is also important to recognise that our office staff have increasingly taken on more direct input into broader activities such as Mainsheet, and with the employment of the training coordinator operational responsibilities for on water matters.

The final graph shows the position of our cash reserves and overall equity (net value of our assets) from 2007/2008 to 2016/2017.

As would be expected the two variables closely follow the same trend as cash also constitutes part of net assets. The trends in property reflect depreciation, capital expenditure and maintenance to plants and equipment. To better balance our future and maintain our ageing infrastructure the committee is planning to move to a 5 year plan with a projected forward estimate of revenue and expenditure. This is important to overcome the club getting major expenditure surprises. When looking at our cash position it must be remembered that it contains an amount of \$41,440 that cannot be drawn on as it is a bank guarantee to the State Government for the waterbed lease.

We have had a good season from a Sailing Coordinator point of view. The 2 short course regattas ran well with a few visiting boats. HMAS Perth was a success with more boats this year than last. We have had some feedback from handicap starts that we at Regatta will take forward into next year. We ran a heat of the SpaceSailor 22 state championships in early January. We ran a very successful National championships for the Fireball association over the Christmas break

Over March the Cruisers visited Perth Flying Squadron and Claremont Yacht Clubs for their respective invitational events. We hope to draw on this good will to see more boats visiting Nedlands for our invitationals.

The Start Sailing and Better Sailing courses have been great for the club. We are in the middle of the 4<sup>th</sup> Start Sailing course and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Better Sailing course for the season. As I have noted throughout the year, these courses are a great pace to find a crew if you are looking for one. The participants are all willing to get on boats after their course.

There is plenty of work to be done over the Winter break. Season 18/19 race calendar to be completed, the WA State Schools Team championships and plenty of maintenance on the training fleet over the Busy Bees.


